

The **emerald ash borer** (*Agrilus planipennis*), also known by the acronym **EAB**, is a green <u>buprestid</u> or jewel beetle native to north-eastern Asia that feeds on <u>ash species</u>. Females lay eggs in bark crevices on ash trees, and larvae feed underneath the bark of ash trees to emerge as adults in one to two years. In its native range, it is typically found at low densities and does not cause significant damage to trees native to the area. Outside its native range, it is an <u>invasive species</u> and is highly destructive to <u>ash trees</u> native to Europe and North America. As some of you have noticed we have begun the removal of these ash trees on the course that have been affected by the EAB. As trees are removed we will look at replacing trees in appropriate locations.



Parent/Child/Family Fun Golf #3

Ball Marks

The image below is from the Golf Course Superintendents Association of America and shows the proper way to repair a ball mark on the green. Notice in step 3 it says, "don't lift the center." This is a key to proper ball mark repair. Lifting the center of the ball mark detaches the roots and the grass in that spot will die. Many of the "unrepaired" ball marks you see when playing are actually "improperly repaired" ball marks. These take weeks to heal compared to days for a properly repaired ball mark.



Please take care of your course. Repair your divots and fill in some others while you wait for your playing partners to hit. On the greens, repair your ball mark and one other. The result will be a better golf course and more enjoyable playing experience for all.

- 2. Avoid driving on heavily travelled areas with your golf cart. Excessive traffic leads to a poorer stand of grass and eventually mud. A simple rule is to leave the path in a different spot than the cart before you. We kindly ask you to use the carts paths as much as possible at all times. It doesn't take any more effort to follow the 90 degree rule at all times. Your course will look better for it. Also, golf carts need to return to the cart paths near all tees and greens. These are the areas that have the highest areas of cart traffic. A good rule to follow is once you're approximately 30 yards from the green you need to return to the cart path for the remainder of that hole. Also, please partner up on carts. Two players should = one cart, three players should two carts and four players should = two carts. As we move into the hot and dry season the less cart traffic we have on the grass plant the better!
- 3. Please allow us the opportunity to acknowledge you and get out of the way before you hit your shot. Please note that we may need to "finish one pass" before we pull to the side. Because of the fast pace of play here at your club, the fact that not everyone plays the course in order and the number of singles and twosomes it makes it extremely difficult to "stay ahead of play" or avoid play all together.
- 4. Per the member handbook we'd like to remind everyone that the maintenance staff schedules their workload believing that most golfers play the course in order. As a result, if you cutover or simply begin on a random hole, you may run into the maintenance staff mowing rough or fairways, greens or collars, or cutting holes. THE MAINTENANCE STAFF HAS TO HAVE THE RIGHT OF WAY IN THIS SCENARIO, WHERE YOU DON'T PLAY THE COURSE IN ORDER, SO THEY CAN COMPLETE THEIR MAINTENANCE FOR THE DAY. The player who has cutover, or simply started on a random hole, should expect to have to wait, skip a shot, skip a hole, and go around the maintenance staff.

High School Boy's Golf Team and the Practice Facility

Indianola Country Club is the home course for Indianola High School Golf. The fall season is when the boys' team competes. The high school varsity golfers who are members of our club will be allowed to play Saturday and Sunday mornings during their high school season. Coach Finn will provide a list of names of these players so that our staff has record of who these players are. Please note that we have asked the boys to park in the

parking lot on days when they are on the range, so they don't have 15 cars down on the street clogging up traffic and taking parking spots away from our members. Therefore, you may see some of our junior members walking down/up the cart path on #1 during Wednesday's and Thursday's when they are not allowed to play.

Remember, they have not been playing they are simply walking back up to their cars once practice is over on the range.

Simpson College Men's and Women's Golf Team

The Men's and Women's teams at Simpson college also utilize our facility as their home course. Dress Code Policy for Members & Guests

In the last month we have observed a few of our members and guests not following our dress code policy. The below policy has been in place of over four years now, so we are expecting everyone to be observant of the policy put in place by your Board of Directors.

Golf Course Dress Code = At Indianola Country Club we want all of our members and guests to have an enjoyable experience during their round of golf. The membership at Indianola Country Club prides themselves on having a private club experience with affordable prices. The goal at our club is to allow casual dress with the understanding that we are a private facility. Muscle shirts, tank tops, un-hemmed cut offs and tee shirts with graphics are not allowed. A solid-colored tee shirt without graphics and in good condition is allowed. However, outerwear pieces, such as sweatshirts, will be allowed with graphics if the graphics are not inappropriate. A collared golf shirt and golf related layering piece is our preferred choice. Our female members and guests are allowed to wear sleeveless golf shirts designed for the golf course. Female golfers must wear a top and bottom that doesn't reveal too much. Again, we want our dress code to be relaxed but not to the point that others find it distracting, disturbing or inappropriate. Golf Shoes or golf sandals with soft spikes or athletic shoes must be always worn while playing. Members and guests are not allowed to play barefooted or with footwear that could damage the grass plant. It is every member's responsibility to make sure their guests are aware of our dress code policy on the golf course.

Clubhouse Dress Code = At Indianola Country Club we want all of our members and guests to have an enjoyable and relaxed experience. Muscle shirts, tank tops, un-hemmed cut offs, dirty and or poor conditioned clothing, any piece of apparel with inappropriate graphics or suggestive sayings are not allowed. Our goal is to give you every opportunity to enjoy your clubhouse experience in a casual yet neat appearance. It is every member's responsibility to make sure their guests are aware of our dress code policy prior to entering the clubhouse.
