REGULAR MEMBERSHIPS

Junior (under 30), Intermediate (30-35), Full Family (over 35), Heritage (any member 65 years of age and a member for at least 25 consecutive years), Distance (residing 25+ miles away) Family:

A legally married couple.

An unmarried child living with a club member and less than 19 years of age, or an unmarried child less than 23 years of age, enrolled full-time and working toward a college undergraduate degree, may play on their parents' membership at no charge. A child of a member, who becomes eligible for membership, is not required to pay the initiation fee. Other exceptions will be considered by a written petition to the Board of Directors.

Single:

A single (unmarried) individual.

There are three categories for single members: Junior (under 30), Intermediate (30-35), Full (35+)

Heritage:

Any member 65 years of age and a member for at least 25 consecutive years.

Heritage Single Member \$160.00/month Heritage Family Member \$194.00/month

Social:

This membership allows access to the clubhouse only. \$26.00/month Social Members may purchase a season range pass. \$150.00/season

Student:

Ages 11 – 13 - \$275.00 + 7% sales tax Ages 14 – 17 - \$400.00 + 7% sales tax Ages 18 - 22 - \$450.00 + 7% sales tax

These memberships allow limited access to the golf course and clubhouse, as listed in the section under Junior Golf Guidelines.

Corporate:

Bronze Membership \$2500.00 + 7% sales tax

Allows (50) rounds of 18 holes of golf with cart, in addition access to dining/clubhouse privileges on the day of play.

Gold Membership \$4500.00 + 7% sales tax

Allows (100) rounds of 18 holes of golf with cart, in addition access to dining/clubhouse privileges on the day of play.

Distance Membership:

This membership is available for those who reside 25+ miles from Indianola Country Club.

Distance Single \$125.00/monthDistance Family \$150.00/month

Non-Member Ladies League:

Nonmembers may participate in ladies league. The fee for the 15 weeks of league is \$570 + 7% sales tax. This fee covers the 15 weeks of league with cart for nine holes along with the fee for the Ladies Golf Association.

MEMBERSHIP DUES & FEES

Dues and fees shall include member dues, capital improvement fees, and cart/cart shed/trail fees ("Member Dues and Fees"). Effective April 1, 2020, Indianola Country Club Member Dues and Fees shall be remitted via ACH directly to Indianola Country Clubs checking account. Members paying via ACH have the option to pay annually, quarterly, or monthly. Payment notices **will not** be mailed to the members on ACH. Each month our monthly newsletter will list the monthly dues and fees for each class of membership as a reminder of the scheduled withdrawal from a member's account which takes place on the 10th of the month. If the 10th happens to be a Sunday or holiday this withdraw will occur on the next bank business day.

GRANDFATHER CLAUSE: Members currently not using ACH may elect to receive a quarterly notice and pay their dues and fees via check or money order. There will be a \$15 fee for each billing cycle, i.e. monthly/quarterly to cover the administrative costs. Membership Dues and Fees shall be due on the 10th day of the billing cycle and late payment will result in

additional fees as listed in the Indianola Country Club By-laws. The administrative fee will be waived for members paying their Membership Dues and Fees via one annual payment. This annual payment will be due between January $1^{st} - 10^{th}$.

Membership Dues and Fees paid by credit and debit card shall incur a 5% convenience fee to help offset the processing cost incurred by Indianola Country Club under the contract with the merchant card vendor. Those electing to pay via credit card will also need to pay with one annual payment due between January $1^{st} - 10^{th}$.

A fee of \$25 will be charged for returned checks or an ACH that cannot be processed due to insufficient funds in the account. In the event an ACH is denied, Indianola Country Club member shall immediately deliver funds for the amount past due plus fee along with an instruction letter to the member's bank re-authorizing Indianola Country Club to ACH the account for future payments. This letter and check or money order must be delivered to Indianola Country Clubs accountants at Shull & Co. 1111 N. Jefferson Indianola

GUESTS & FEES

- All members who have a guest for golf must be sure the guest registers in the clubhouse, and the appropriate fees are paid by the guest or member. Failure of the member or guest to pay these fees will result in the member being billed.
- If the clubhouse is not open at the time of tee-off, the fees are to be paid at the completion of the round.
- Non-members living in Warren or Polk County may be a guest a maximum of four (4) times per year. Non-members must have approval of the PGA Club Professional or must be accompanied by a member. Persons living outside of these geographical boundaries can play an unlimited number of rounds when accompanied by a member and/or with approval of the PGA Club Professional.

RESIGNATION RULES & PROCEDURES

- Resignations will only be accepted twice per season. Members, who have met their agreement, may resign on either January 1st or July 1st.
 - Resignations made with no dues owed on January 1st or July 1st will be accepted, but dues owed after resignation, whether by own volition or Board action, not paid within 90 days from the date of resignation, will be recovered by Small Claims Court action.
- Former members who leave the club owing dues are prohibited from use of the facilities, as a guest of a member, or playing in any Club sponsored tournament. Payment of this debt lifts the restrictions.
- Once the resignation has been recorded, a member resigning may not re-apply for membership for one year. This policy may be appealed to the Board of Directors in the death of a primary member of a Family Membership, and/or other extenuating circumstances.

RETURN TO GOLF MEMBERSHIP FROM SOCIAL MEMBERSHIP

Golfing members who drop to social membership status may return to golf membership status as follows:

- If the member has been a social member for less than 12 months, they must pay back golf dues.
- If the member has been a social member for more than 12 months, they may return to golf status by paying an initiation fee equal to the difference between the current initiation fee and the initiation fee at the time they dropped to social status.
- In each case, if there is a waiting list, they will be placed on the list as if they were a new member applying for membership.

LEAVE OF ABSENCE

- Any member may request a leave of absence in writing, and each request will be reviewed by the Board of Directors on an individual basis.
- This is not intended to be for a short-term illness or injury, but one that will keep a member from playing golf for a minimum of three (3) months.
- Leaves will not be granted during November February, and dues would be expected paid during those normal non-golfing months.

MEMBER TERMINATION, PROBATION, & REINSTATEMENTS

- The Board of Directors, by an affirmative vote of two-thirds of the Board members present, shall have full power to suspend, cancel, or place on probation the membership of any member for a violation or continued violations of any Club rules.
- The affected member shall be notified in writing by the Board President at least fifteen days prior to disciplinary action by the Board.

- The affected member must be given the opportunity to address the Board either orally or in writing, not less than five days before the effective date of the disciplinary action.
- If the member requests to be heard, the Board shall consider all relevant facts and circumstances surrounding the violation(s) and disciplinary action.

 If needed, the Board shall affirm or change their previous vote tally in the presence of the member who is under consideration for the disciplinary action.

PLAYER SIGN-IN & PACE OF PLAY

- Our club does not accept tee time reservations.
- All play is to start on the #1 tee unless directed by the Club Professional or a member of the clubhouse staff.
- We encourage players to join other groups to alleviate too many singles and twosomes. Pairing up should promote a faster pace of play. It is important to note that singles and twosomes do not take precedence over threesomes and foursomes. If a group of 3, 4 or even 5 is playing at an acceptable pace of play singles and twosomes should NOT expect to play through.
- Members are welcome to play as quickly as they feel comfortable, but not cause undue delays in play for other golfers. You are expected to allow faster groups to play through if your pace of play is causing undue delay. The time to allow faster groups to play through is when there is an open hole ahead of your group. Pace of play is important to enjoying golf, and if your group is not playing at an acceptable pace, the Club Professional will assist you in improving your pace of play.
- 5-Somes are allowed if they can play at a pace which is acceptable to avoid holding up the pace of play for others.
- The Club Professional is responsible for monitoring all golf groups.

An acceptable pace of play is a two hour nine- or four-hour round of 18 played in a foursome or fivesome.

CLUBHOUSE DRESSCODE & BEHAVIOR

- At Indianola Country Club we want all our members and guests to have an enjoyable and relaxed experience.
- Muscle shirts, tank tops, un-hemmed cut offs, dirty and or poor conditioned clothing, any piece of apparel with inappropriate graphics or suggestive sayings are not allowed. Our goal is to give you every opportunity to enjoy your clubhouse experience in a casual yet neat appearance. Excessive language of an offensive nature, or loud and boisterous behavior which disturbs other members, is not allowed.
- It is every member's responsibility to make sure they and/or their guests adhere to these standards.
- Tobacco products of any kind, including vape devices, are not allowed.
- Violations of the attire and/or behavior guidelines must be reported to the Club Professional.

- You may NOT cut over to #11 from#1 on Saturday and Sunday mornings.
- No one should expect to cut to #11 after playing #1. However, we understand wants and needs for some of our members to play what's referred to as the East Nine. At times when the course is busy members will not have the opportunity to play just the East Nine. Please consult either the PGA Professional or a member of the staff if you would like to cutover to the 11th hole after playing #1. All play coming from the west nine takes precedence and you may not hold up any of that play.
- The maintenance staff schedules their workload believing that most golfers play the course in the order it was intended to play which is 1-18. As a result, if you don't play the course in order, the maintenance staff always has the right of way. You also may be asked to stop for a while or directed to another hole by anyone on the staff.

GOLF COURSE CLOSURE DUE TO MAINTENANCE

- Every attempt will be made to keep maintenance course closures on Mondays, but sometimes the weather dictates otherwise.
- During the golf season, one nine may be closed at any given time during the day. This type of maintenance typically involves spraying of pesticides or top-dressing greens. These tasks need to allow drying time before golfers can play. These closures could occur in the morning or afternoon, depending on the weather.

Members need to understand some maintenance must be done based on weather and not a
specific day of the week. Please check with the clubhouse about course status before
starting your round.

DRIVING RANGE & PRACTICE GREENS

This is not a public practice facility.

- Our driving range provides a good opportunity for all members to improve their game. Range tokens are complimentary and available in the clubhouse. These tokens will be used to access golf balls from the machine.
- There are several hitting stalls available for members and their guests. You must hit balls
 only from between the white hitting stalls, unless inclement weather makes it necessary to
 hit off the mats.
- Please be respectful of the homes on the west side of the range, and refrain from hitting any balls in that direction. Members and guests need to understand they are responsible for any damage due to an errant golf shot.
- There will be times where the tee line may be in a position that does not allow you the opportunity to practice your long game. You are not allowed to hit balls through the practice range and onto the course.
- If there is not anyone utilizing the range you may hit drivers, or any other club that is hit off a tee and not taking a divot, from the back of the tee. When someone does come you must then go back to the designated area.
- A large putting green and chipping area is also available for practice.
- You are not allowed to hit chip or pitch shots onto the putting green which would cause ball marks.
- Please check all signage at the range, should there be special requests from the maintenance staff.

Code of Conduct

This code of conduct has been developed to ensure a safe, friendly, and respectful place for members, guests, and staff. This document is intended to develop a spirit of cooperation and understanding between our staff and membership to insure a friendly and safe member experience.

All members and guests will:

- Acknowledges Indianola Country Club is a family friendly environment and, therefore, refrains from using obscenities, insults, and loud boisterous and inappropriate language whether on the course or in the clubhouse.
- Respect the golf course, golf cars and facilities.

- Adhere to the dress code and observe proper golf etiquette as well as USGA and local rules of the course. (Ex: following cart signs, or not hitting into the group in front of you and respecting pace of play.)
- Adhere to all club rules (non-all-inclusive list below)
 - Each group should sign in prior to teeing off in Mulligans. Special notices for the day will be posted at the sign in area.
 - Safe operation of the rental carts and insuring there are two member/guests on each cart.
 - We kindly ask that members and guests refrain from taking single carts. A
 2 some should play in one cart while 3 somes and 4 somes in two
 carts. Fuel prices are at an all-time high, and we would like to avoid
 additional increases.
 - O Golf carts must remain on the path on all five par 3's except for being able to leave the path short of the creek on hole #7 and #9.
 - Seeking staff approval prior to not playing all holes in order. One should never
 expect to not play in order on busy days. We understand that Indianola Country
 Club is not a walker friendly course nor is it a convenient layout when only
 playing nine holes.
 - If one chooses to not play the course in order the clubs maintenance staff will have the right of way and you should not expect them to stop their maintenance.
 - o If one isn't playing the course in order, they must allow faster groups to immediately play through.
 - Obeying all signage on the golf course.
- Demonstrates an understanding that members and guests have no authority to instruct staff in daily tasks and job performance.
- Does not denigrate, or talk down to staff members, general membership and/or does not misrepresent their position and/or authority to others.
- Understands that all beverages including alcoholic beverages must be purchased from the Club. Additionally, and member/guest may be denied further bar service at the discretion of the staff and or manager.
- Understands that the membership through the Board of Directors may make suggestions and/or directives to the club management regarding the operation of the Club.

JUNIOR GOLF RESTRICTIONS

• Junior Members ages 10 & under must always play with an adult.

They can play:

Monday – All day with adult supervision

Tuesday - All day with adult supervision

Wednesday - Until 12:00 noon with adult supervision

Thursday - Until 12:00 noon with adult supervision

Friday – All day with adult supervision

Saturday & Sunday – After 11:00 a.m. with adult supervision

• **Junior Members ages 11 - 13** must play with an adult on weekends and after 4:00 p.m. They can play:

Monday - Without adult supervision until 4:00 p.m. and with adult supervision after 4:00 p.m.

Tuesday - Without adult supervision until 4:00 p.m. and with adult supervision after 4:00 p.m.

Wednesday - Without adult supervision until Noon.

Thursday - Without adult supervision until Noon.

Friday – Without adult supervision until 4:00 p.m. and with adult supervision after 4:00 p.m.

Saturday & Sunday – After 11:00 a.m. with adult supervision.

• Junior Members ages 14 - 17 may play unaccompanied by an adult.

They can play:

Monday - Anytime

Tuesday - Anytime

Wednesday – Must be teed off by noon and off the course by 4:00 p.m.

Thursday - Must be teed off by noon and off the course by 4:00 p.m.

Friday – Anytime

Saturday & Sunday – Any time after 10:00 a.m. or prior to 10:00 a.m. with an adult.

- Loitering in the clubhouse and pro shop is not allowed.
- Junior golfers ages 16-17 may play in all club-sponsored tournaments except Memorial Day, 4th of July and Labor Day.

Any junior golfer under the age of 16, who wishes to play in a club sponsored event other than those three tournaments, must receive permission from the golf professional.

JUNIOR GOLF CAMP

- The Junior Golf Camp is coordinated and conducted by the PGA Golf Professional.
- The Junior Golf Camp is held each summer for five consecutive days in June.
- The camp is open to golfers aged 6 17.
- Juniors are divided into age divisions based on the number of participants.
- Each day each division will have one hour of instruction.
- This camp is available to members and non-members.

MEN'S DAY GOLF

- Men's Day is on Thursday's and begins on June 2nd and runs through August 25th.
- Only men 18 years of age and over can tee-off after 12:00 noon.
- Women and junior golfers ages 14 17 must tee off before noon and be off the course and out of the clubhouse by 4:00 p.m.

- The West Nine, holes 2 10, reopen for all member play at 6:30 p.m.
- The practice facility does not have any restrictions on Men's Day.

MEN'S GOLF ASSOCIATION

- The Men's Golf Association is open to all male members of the Club.
- The Men's Golf Association raises funds through membership and special events to assist the Club with special purchases & projects not allocated by the Club's annual budget to improve the golfing and/or dining experiences for all members.
- The yearly membership fee is \$25 which allows the Association members the opportunity to play in a variety of golf activities on Men's Day.
- An Association member qualifies for a \$100 gift card if they record a witnessed hole-inone during the year.

MEN'S GOLF LEAGUE

- Men's League is on Tuesday nights beginning on May 3rd and ending on September 13th.
- Participants in league must be a member of the Men's Golf Association.
- League is teams of two and competition is nine holes of match play each week.
- Because this is a NET league each player will need a GHIN handicap.
- The course is NOT closed during men's league.
- With both nines available, players not in league should have little problem getting on either nine as long as they understand there may be a wait between 4:15 5:30.

WOMEN'S DAY GOLF

- Women's Day is on Wednesday's and begins June 1st and runs through August 31st.
- Only ladies 18 years of age and over can tee-off after 12:00 noon.
- Men and junior golfers ages 14 17 must tee off before noon and be off the course and out of the clubhouse by 4:00 p.m.
- The West Nine, holes 2 10, reopen for all member play at 6:30 p.m.
- The practice facility does not have any restrictions on Women's Day.

WOMEN'S GOLF ASSOCIATION

- The Women's Golf Association is open to all female members of the Club.
- The focus for this group is to have fun and get to know other women either on the course or in the clubhouse.
- The Association sponsors two fundraisers each year: A Salad Luncheon in April, which has been cancelled for 2022 due to COVID, and a Women's Golf Invitational in June. This allows them to assist the Club with special purchases & projects not allocated by the Club's annual budget to improve the golfing and/or dining experiences for all members.

- Funds are also used to sponsor a golf scholarship for a graduating senior (details of the scholarship can be found on the club website).
- The Association hosts the Women's Golf League and many other golf & social activities for its members.

WOMEN'S GOLF LEAGUE

- Women's League is on Wednesday evenings beginning on June 1st and ending on August 31st.

- For more competitive golfers, there is a match play division, and entry level golfers, a best shot division.
- A GHIN handicap is required for participation in the match play division.
- Please note that **the course is not closed** during the league season and all female members and guests of the club are welcome to play regardless of whether they are in league.

TOURNAMENT INFORMATION

The Club holds a variety of tournaments and other golf events for the enjoyment of the members and to promote our course in the local golf community. Advanced sign-up is required for all tournaments. Tournament Gold Tee Policy - For club tournaments in which only members are allowed to play and handicaps from the GHIN computer are used for scoring and or pairing purposes, gold tees are allowed for players ages 60 and above who have at least 10 of the last 20 rounds in the computer from the gold tees. Participants in these events who are ages 60, and above who do not have at least 10 scores in the computer from the gold tees, will be required to play from the white tee markers. For tournaments in which non-members are allowed to play and gold tees are utilized, any player who is age 60 and above may play from the gold tees.
